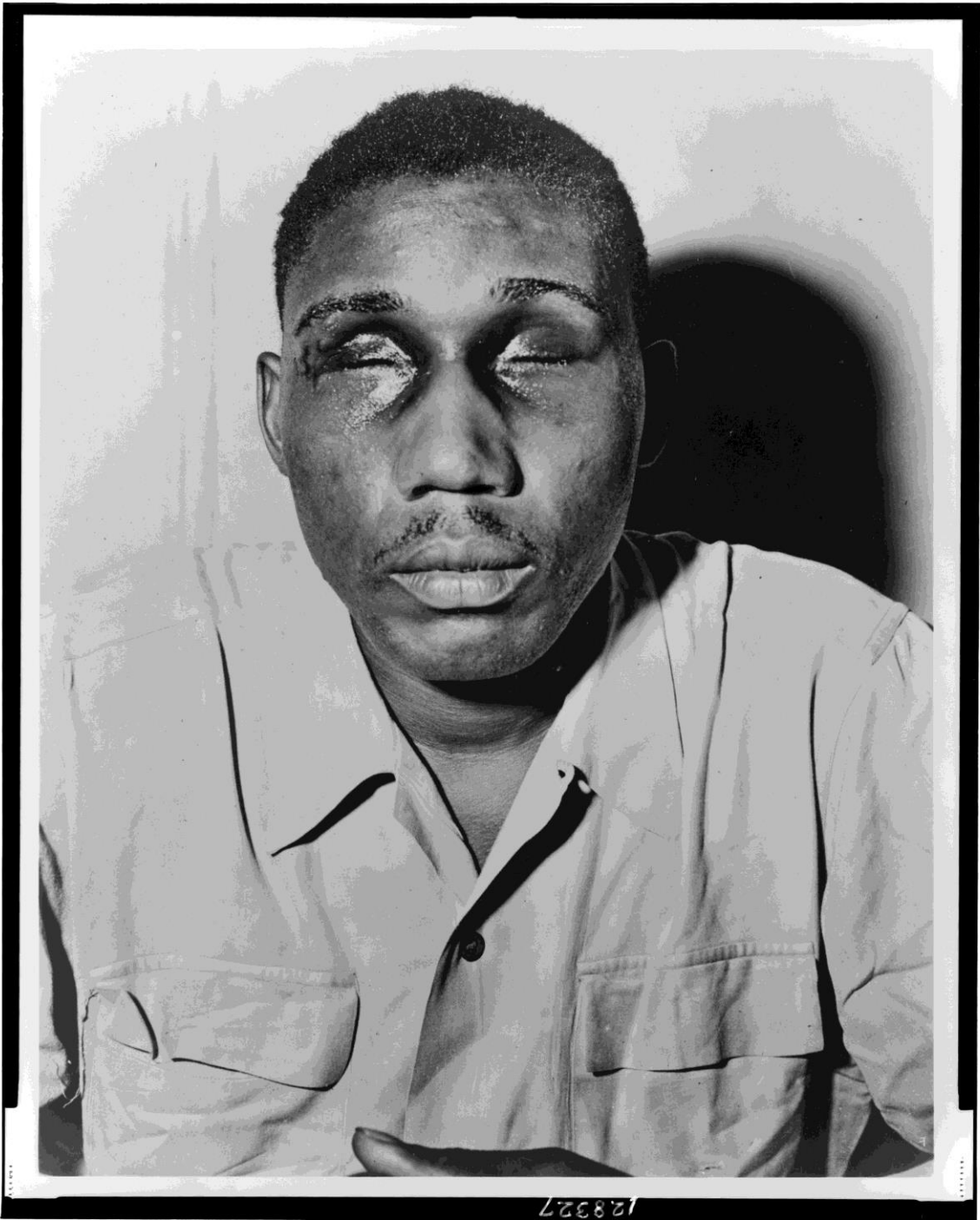

EXTRA — By Executive Order

PRESIDENT TRUMAN WIPES OUT SEGREGATION IN ARMED FORCES

2nd Order Sets Up FEPC In All Government Jobs

In a dramatic and historic move, unprecedented since the time of Lincoln, President Harry Truman issued Monday afternoon two executive orders which down forever Jim Crowism in the Armed Forces of the United States and guarantee equal job opportunities in the Federal government, and all of its branches.

Executive Order "No. 1"

Establishing President's Committee on Equality of Treatment and Opportunity in the Armed Services.

Whereas, it is essential that there be maintained in the Armed Services of the United States the highest standards of democracy, with equality of treatment and opportunity for all those who serve in our country's defense;

Now, therefore, by virtue of the authority vested in me as President of the United States, by the Constitution and the Statutes of the United States and as Commander in Chief of the Armed Services, it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. It is hereby declared to be the policy of the President that there shall be equality of treatment and opportunity for all persons in the armed services with

out regard to race, color, religion or national origin. This policy shall be put into effect as rapidly as possible, having due regard to the time required to formulate any necessary changes without impairing efficiency or morale.

2. There shall be created in the national military establishment an Advisory Committee to be known as the "President's Committee on Equality of Treatment and Opportunity in the Armed Services," which shall be composed of 7 members to be designated by the President.

3. The Committee is authorized on behalf of the President to examine into the policy, procedure, and practices of the armed

services in order to determine in what respect such rules, procedures, and practices may be altered or improved with a view thereto. **WIPES OUT** Plan to

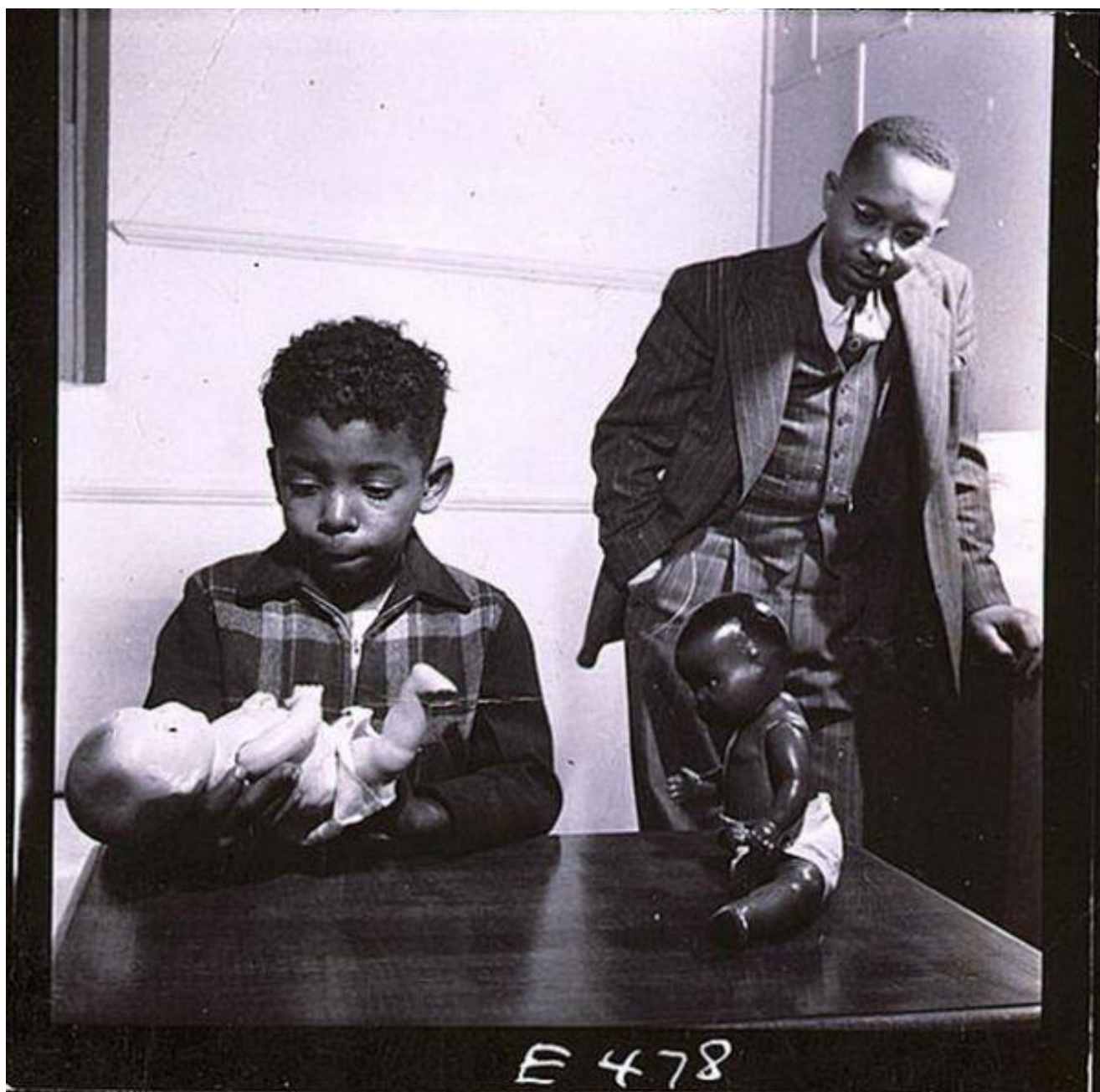

MR. CHIEF JUSTICE WARREN delivered the opinion of the Court.
