Ray T. Khirallah Jr. has tried injury cases to verdict throughout Texas and has developed specific expertise in handling severe and catastrophic injuries in diverse venues. He has secured multi-billion and multimillion-dollar verdicts and settlements in oilfield, 18-wheeler, premises liability, and other cases throughout the state.

Ray is frequently asked to be a speaker on trial issues at Texas State Bar CLE courses, including the Advanced Personal Injury seminar, the Damages in Civil Litigation and products liability seminars.

He moved back home to Dallas to join Hamilton Wingo, LLP after practicing for several years in South Texas. Ray worked as journalist and high school teacher for five years before attending law school in Boston.

Ray's recent verdicts and successes include:

- \$7.37 billion jury verdict in a wrongful death case alleging negligence and gross negligence against a Fortune 100 company. The verdict included \$375 million in compensatory damages for the family of the 83-year-old victim.
- \$1 million verdict in Dallas County on a wreck involving a construction van and a small SUV resulting in hip and back injuries.
- \$3 million settlement for an oilfield worker who suffered back and knee injuries in a multi-fatality wreck involving an over-turned tractor trailer.
- \$2.8 million settlement in a premises case involving an oil field injury. The case was tried for two weeks and settled before closing arguments.
- Substantial jury verdict in a premises liability case involving a patron injured by a falling speaker at a city-owned venue.
- Confidential seven-figure settlement in a premises liability case involving a hotel patron who suffered multiple facial fractures after tripping over a light.
- Confidential settlement for a restaurant patron who fell over an unprotected ledge in the parking lot of a restaurant and broke his elbow and ankle.
